

Bachelor's-Master's transition for IDE-Masters 2021-2022

On 6 May, the Executive Board decided, like last year, to allow a temporary measure for the Bachelor's-Master's transition ([also see the TU Delft Corona website](#)). This message will further explain the 2021-2022 temporary measure.

Content of the temporary Bachelor's-Master's transition

For Bachelor's students and Pre-Master's students who are enrolled at a Dutch university or a Dutch institute of higher professional education in the 2020-2021 academic year, the following principles apply:

For Bachelor's students:

- Bachelor's students who have a deficit of up to 15 EC in their Bachelor's examination programme on 31 August 2021 may enrol in Master's subjects in the 2021-2022 academic year and participate in Master's subjects examinations.
- The Faculty IDE has decided to designate the course IO3900 BSc Final Project, or a similar final project from a Bachelor programme, as an entry requirement for the three IDE Masters, for students who wish to use the temporary measures for the Bachelor's-Master's transition.
- The possibility to enrol in Master's courses without having completed a Bachelor's programme expires on 31 August 2022.

For students in the IDE adaptation program:

- IDE adaptation students who have a deficit of up to 15 EC in their IDE adaptation programme on 31 August 2021 may enrol in Master's subjects in the 2021-2022 academic year and participate in Master's subjects examinations.
- The Faculty IDE has decided to designate the BSc Final Project from the IDE adaptation programme as an entry requirement for the three IDE Masters, for students who wish to use the temporary measures for the Bachelor's-Master's transition.
- The possibility to enrol in Master's courses without having completed the IDE adaptation programme expires on 31 August 2022.

Additional regulations

- It is stipulated that students can make use of the temporary Bachelor's-before-Master's rule once and with a maximum duration of 1 year. It is therefore not possible to add up two of these temporary rules.

- Results achieved in the academic year 2021-2022 in one of our master's programs will be added to the MSc examination program as soon as there is a valid registration for the relevant MSc program.
- In the academic year 2021-2022, **no** admission requirements for the MSc electives (see article 11a, paragraph 2, 3a and 3b of the TER) apply. An exception to this is the MSc elective ID5010 Internship; for this elective, the admission requirements in article 11a of the TER remain in force.
- The education regulations of the master's programs IPD, Dfl and SPD 2021-2022 apply to the master's courses that the BSc student takes in 2020/2021.
